Collaborations Sought for Arctic Art & Science Event

With the UAF Art Department, the ASSW Local Organizing Committee will host *Arctic Perspectives* — an art-science collaborative show — during the 2016 Arctic Science Summit Week.

Art inspired by the Arctic and created by UAF students, faculty, and other community members will be on display throughout Arctic Science Summit Week, from March 12-20, 2016.

ELIGIBILITY

Open to all arts and science professionals working in Arctic influenced science or arts-related areas.

All work must be original, executed between December 2015 and March 2016, and directly connect with Arctic science issues.

Selected participants should be able to deliver their work to the UAF Art Department Gallery by **March 9, 2016**.

JURORS

A panel of jurors selected from UAF arts and science departments will review all entries for both quality of work and relevance to the Arctic Science Summit Week.

COLLABORATIONS

Collaborations between artists and scientists are strongly encouraged, and some travel funding is available to support field trips for a few collaborative teams.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

1. Short statement of Arctic research performed or area of Arctic research you are interested in exploring through the arts (250 words or less).

2. Biographical statement.
A short statement about yourself and your background, or a two page CV.

3. Four photos, graphics, or writing samples. These should be related to your research (e.g. fieldwork pictures, lab result images, or portfolio images) and should act as an illustration of your work. Artists should submit portfolio images and writers can submit short writing samples.

4. Indicate if you are interested in connecting with a collaborative arts or science partner to develop your proposed project. If interested in travel funding, include a general budget estimate.

All materials should be sent in one email with the subject line “Arctic Perspectives Submission” to oalee@alaska.edu no later than **November 30, 2015**.
